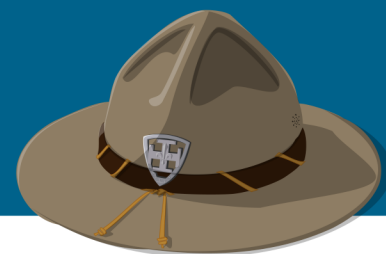

## OUR TROOP

We are part of the Mission Peak District, Golden Gate Area Council of Scouts BSA. Troop 111 has several distinct advantages over others. The medium size of the Troop allows each Scout to interact and learn from each other more closely, helping building their confidence & trust. Also, it allows the Troop to mobilize and move more quickly, thus creating a tailored program based on the Scout's needs.

## OUR MISSION

BSA's mission is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law. Our advancement program is aligned to this mission and creates several opportunities for the scout to advance from outings to fundraising and community and conservation projects. Most scouts reach First class rank by the first year of joining BSA.

## SCOUT ADVANCEMENT

Scouts work on various life skills like safety, cooking, time management, and goal setting to advance through the scout ranks.



- Requirements for each rank is listed in Scoutbook
- Takes about 1.5 years to reach First Class rank and 6 months for each rank above that.
- Focus shifts to leadership development from Star to Eagle
- Scoutmaster conference: once per rank discussion with scout and SM
- Board of Review (BOR): determine the quality of scout's experience and whether scout has completed all requirements.
- Twice a year Troop elections allow leadership rotation and also meet 6 mo. requirement

## RECHARTERING

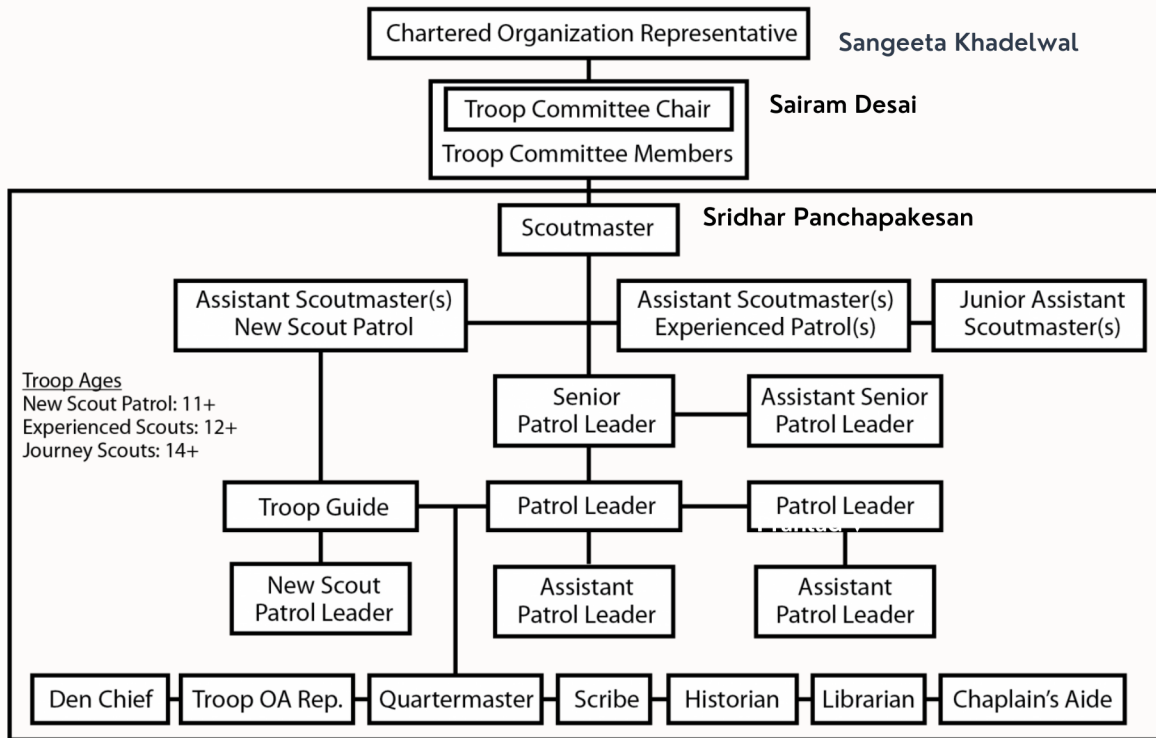

# TROOP ORGANIZATION



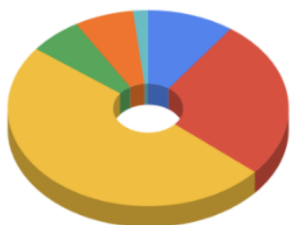
## PROGRAM MANAGEMENT
